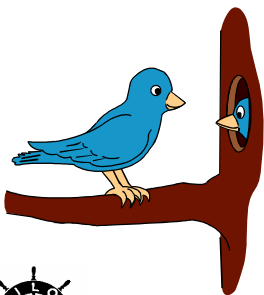

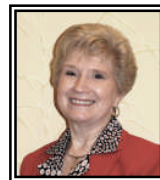

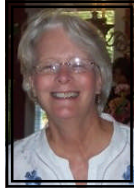

PIF PROGRAM CHANGES

This is a friendly reminder that your Matching Grant Applications must be postmarked by October 1st and mailed to me, Brenda Walker, GA District PIF Rep, 201 Farm Estates Road, Perry, GA 31069. Because of the short turnaround time in which I have to review the grants and get them to HQ, please don't wait until the last minute to mail them. I will appreciate time to review and clarify any questions I have before forwarding them to PIF. So the sooner you can get the applications to me, the better. Please note that only Grants submitted on the July 23, 2009 application will be accepted. This form may be obtained from the PI website.

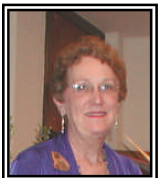
I also need to let you know about some PIF program changes that were implemented by the Board of Trustees at the PI Convention in San Diego. I'll speak to Grants now. Watch for scholarship program changes in next month's Governor's Bulletin.

1. Wii Win Program requests will follow the same funding cycle as the Matching Grant Program.
2. Wii Win Program requests must be submitted on the Matching Grant Application and postmarked by October 1st as discussed above.
3. Choose Category 7 when filling out the Matching Grant Application for the Wii Win Program.
4. The Wii Win Program will be governed by the same policies as the Matching Grant Program. The ONLY exception is that the minimum request is lowered to \$250.

I'm looking forward to a deluge of grant applications coming my way!

Pilot Club of Dublin is 38 years old with a current membership of 39 active members, four (4) E-members, and two (2) emeritus members. This club is well known for their work with BrainMinders. Annually, every first grade student (approximately 760) in the county, city, public and private schools is given a safety helmet following a very funny, yet informative puppet show. PC of Dublin continues to serve the community with 193 subscribers to Project Lifeline which allows individuals to continue to live independently in their homes with the security of knowing that help is just a “push of their button” away.

to participate in "The Best of the Best" at Pilot International in San Diego. The project selected is a puppet show for senior adults. They targeted senior brain safety based on statistics which report that annually 1.6 million seniors visit emergency rooms nationwide due to head injuries sustained from falls in their homes.

The goal for the project was to create a safety program appropriate for Senior Adults that would be both educational and entertaining and to integrate a variety of character voices and interactive features to grab and hold the attention of seniors.

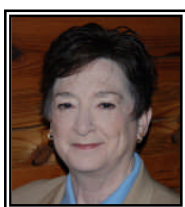
They wrote an original interactive script for a Senior Adult puppet show using BrainMinder characters. The club engaged the help of a talented Speech/Language Pathologist to record a variety of voices and accents for each of the animals. All members of the club recorded the original ending song in which seniors are asked to sing along.

A group of talented Pilot Puppeteers (Project Division) is in charge of the show, and other members help with sound equipment and assembling the stage. The total team effort is the reason the program has been well received and successful.

PC of Dublin has been presenting the Senior Puppet Show for only about six (6) months; however, in that short period of time, they have reached 300 plus seniors. The club also presented the Senior Puppet Show at District Convention. A quote from the Pilot Club of Dublin sums up the program. "We wanted the show to be entertaining, but our message rang out plain. Be very careful. You must protect your brain."

Six (6) clubs in the Georgia District and one club from Iowa purchased a copy of the original CD, script and instructions for making the stage. If you would like to try the show, CD's are available from PC of Dublin. After purchasing the CD, the script will be sent via email. If you are interested, send an email to vagarrison3124@aol.com, and I will forward your email to Diane Stuckey, president of PC of Dublin.

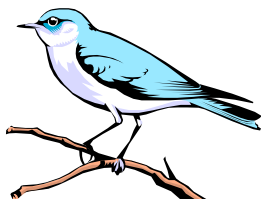
